


## **Ashfield Girls' High School**

# Newsletter









Congratulations to our Year 12 and Year 14 students on their outstanding results. Our students have displayed high levels of academic resilience in how they approached their assessment, while showing determination through lockdowns and courage in returning to face-to-face teaching. It was not easy and we are incredibly proud of their engagement with online learning, their ability to become more independent learners, their agility to manage the ever-changing assessment requirements and their drive for success.

We are delighted at the outstanding results achieved by our Year 12s; with 86.7% achieving five GCSE (or equivalent) A\*- C grades and 97.1% achieving five GCSE (or equivalent) A\*- E grades. Year 12 students have transitioned well into our Sixth Form, other further educational providers, apprenticeships or employment. We are proud to welcome 60 Year 12 students back into our growing Sixth Form.

The fantastic results achieved by our Year 14s, with 72.3% achieving three GCE (or equivalent) A\*- C grades and 95.7% achieving three GCE (or equivalent) A\*- E grade, provided endless joy on results day. We have approximately 65% of our Year 14 students progressing to university and 35% moving on to further or higher education, apprenticeships or employment. There are clear and well walked pathways to success at Ashfield Girls' High School.

We are working with the current Sixth Form Senior Leadership Team to re-design the Sixth Form Common Room. We hope that this will be designed and refurbished over the summer break, enabling the team to leave a lasting legacy.

The sustained growth in Sixth Form and the students' desire for more flexible social and study spaces has resulted in a significant investment over the past two years.



#### **Literacy and Numeracy**

As part of the Recovery Curriculum we have developed a comprehensive strategy to support pupils in Year 8 in the development of their literacy and numeracy skills. The photograph above shows Mr Burns working with his class on developing their literacy skills and showing how these skills can improve extended writing in History. Our Literacy Co-ordinator and Numeracy Co-ordinator will be sending a Literacy and Numeracy booklet home with all Year 8 pupils to allow them to further develop their skills with the support of their parents / carers.

#### Library

Our library was refurbished over the summer break using funding from Belfast City Council (medium grant application) and school funds. The new seating and 'cosy' feel adds to the relaxing ambiance making the library a perfect place to develop our pupils' love of reading. We have



also created a 'Literacy Hub' where pupils can avail of one to one or small group literacy support through the Department of Education Engage Programme. Our 'Numeracy Room' is currently under construction (being refurbished) and we hope it will be included in our Newsletter once completed.

#### **East Side Learning**

We are grateful for our link with Eastside Partnership. They have provided funding for a programme of revision classes for pupils in Year 12 so that they can avail of specialist support and guidance with effective revision strategies. There are forty pupils availing of this funded programme in Mathematics and English. We also have a comprehensive revision programme for Science classes in Year 12. We wish all our Year 12 pupils well as they prepare for their English, Mathematics and Science modules in November 2021.



#### **Year 12 Amazing Brains**

Year 12 pupils attended a study skills workshop facilitated by the very popular company, Amazing Brains (Inspire Education). The workshop focused on effective study techniques and how the brain processes information in the working memory (in class) and the necessary work that is required through homework and revision to move that information into long-term memory (learning). Pupils reported that they found the session very informative and that the 'Connections' revision card resource that was provided would be very helpful with independent study. We are developing a whole school strategy to support effective study skills – more on this in the next issue.



Year 10 pupils enjoyed the 'Learn to Earn' workshop facilitated by Young Enterprise. Pupils were able to learn about employability skills, labour market information and salary ranges for many career options. The workshop will hopefully focus Year 10 pupils on the option choice process that begins in term two.

#### Year 12 Magilligan Trip

As part of the Year 12 GCSE Geography course, pupils complete a detailed river study at Magilligan. This fieldwork aims to develop a greater understanding of the processes involved in the work of a river and develops numeracy skills, through the use of specialist measuring and recording equipment. Best wishes to our





geographers as they use the data collected to complete their controlled assessment back in the classroom.



#### Be Daring for Dylan

Thank you to all our staff who ran as part of the relay team in the Belfast Marathon. Thank you to all staff, parents, pupils and our local community who contributed to the fundraising efforts. The Marathon raised over £3000 for the charity. Be Daring for Dylan. Thank you to Mr Crawford (from Crawford Uniforms) for

his generous offer to source and fund staff t-shirts for the marathon endeavour.

#### School Fund – Outdoor Learning Base

We are using our school fund contributions this year to part-fund a state of the art Outdoor Learning Base. The purchase of this base will support our whole school Wellbeing Strategy. School Council and pupil focus groups told us that they wanted to have outdoor learning experiences to take advantage of the beautiful grounds that our school is set within.


